

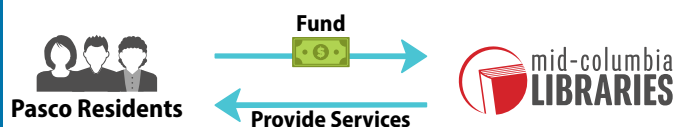
PASCO LIBRARY ANNEXATION VOTE

Mid-Columbia Libraries (MCL) has served Pasco for **53 years** through contracted services. In October the Pasco City Council passed an ordinance expressing the intent to annex. In February 2026, Pasco residents will vote on whether to annex into the library district with a yes or no vote.

WHAT IS ANNEXATION?

Annexation is a process in which voters in a city choose to legally join a library district.



IF ANNEXATION PASSES

- Ensures permanent access to library services
- Pasco residents vote on MCL ballot initiatives, bonds, and levies
- Pasco residents directly fund library services
- MCL is directly accountable to Pasco residents



IF ANNEXATION FAILS

- City will decide a new path for library services
- New contract could change or reduce service levels
